- y \*Community Mental Health Services developed: Assertive Community Treatment Teams, Case management, Crisis Service Centers, Community Support Teams, Crisis Apartments, supported employment, peer support, and Georgia Housing Voucher Program.
- y People with Developmental Disabilities started to be transitioned into community homes from state hospitals



- y Between 201-2015: Independent reviewer filed reports with the court. Many areas of progress, but problem eareas, including:
  - DD:People with developmental disabilities languishing in DD hospitals, problems with community services, problems with quality management.
  - Mental Health: State did not meet Agreement's requirement to have capacity to provide supported housing to any of the 9000 in the target population.
  - Extension Agreement signed May 2016
    - Same Target population, same independent reviewer



- y Extension Agreement stated the partiesticipate" the state will have substantially complied with all provisions of extension agreement by June 30, 2018.
- y Since the signing of Extension Agreement, Independer reviewer continued factoring. Issuedeports, finding compliancewith many provisions continued concerns with supported housing.



- y Reviewer noted in most recent report, Sept. 2018
  - Commitment of Georgia's leadership is a strength



- y Mental Health -- Independen Reviewer's Recommended Findings of Noncompliance Sept. 2018: <u>Supported Housing</u>
  - "State has not yet achieved capacity to serve the approx. 9000 people in the Target Population who need Supported Housing."
  - Ineffective "linkage" of people to Supported Housing (esp. people being released from jails, prisons, ERs)
  - Unified referral process not availablot al att-0.0 Ttc9cRs)
